Pruning & Treatment

Prune Magnolias in early spring when dormant, but remove dead and broken branches when discovered. Minor shaping should be done when young to remove rubbing branches or those that cross through the center of the tree. Remove suckers as needed. Clump varieties can have branches removed to control density and overall shape. Mulch 3-4" deep to protect roots and trunk, maintain moisture, and suppress weeds.

Water

Newly planted Magnolias require daily watering through the warmer growing months, then once or twice a week. Supplemental watering is needed for the first 2-3 years in times of drought, and thorough watering of the entire area encourages better root development. They perform best in average to well-draining soil; avoid over-saturation and watering directly on the foliage. Plant Magnolias with Bio-Tone Starter and fertilize monthly with Wasson Nursery's free liquid fertilizer for 2-3 years, followed by BioAdvanced Rose & Flower Care as directed.
